



Types of acceptable proof of COVID-19 vaccination

A. Vaccine Record Card or Health Record

The person can show the card, a photo of the card as a separate document, or a photo of the card stored on a phone or electronic device.

- CDC COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card (White Card)
- World Health Organization (WHO) Vaccine Record Card (Yellow Card)
- Documentation of vaccination from the healthcare provider or entity that provided the COVID-19 vaccines
- California Immunization Registry (CAIR2) Vaccination Record

B. Digital Vaccination Record Issued by:

- California Department of Public Health (CDPH)
- State or Country approved digital vaccination record *
- An approved company e.g., Healthvana, Carbon Health, CommonPass, CLEAR Health Pass, VaxYes.

* For visitors from other states or countries, we will ask for similar vaccination documentation issued by their local government.

A person who was vaccinated outside the US is considered to be fully vaccinated 14 days after they finish a series of a COVID-19 vaccine that is listed for emergency use by the World Health Organization (WHO). As of January 12, 2022, the following vaccines have obtained EUL:

- Pfizer/BioNTech Comirnaty vaccine
- SII/COVISHIELD and AstraZeneca/AZD1222 vaccines
- Janssen/Ad26.COV 2.S vaccine developed by Johnson & Johnson
- Moderna COVID-19 vaccine (mRNA 1273)
- Sinopharm COVID-19 vaccine
- Sinovac-CoronaVac vaccine
- Bharat Biotech BBV152 COVAXIN vaccine
- Covovax (NVX-CoV2373) vaccine
- Nuvaxovid (NVX-CoV2373) vaccine

We will only be accepting vaccines that are World Health Organization Emergency Use Listing (EUL).

Covid-19 Health Screening Questionnaire

1. Have you experienced any of the following symptoms of COVID-19 within the last 48 hours?
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea
2. Have you tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 10 days?
3. Are you currently awaiting results from a COVID-19 test?
4. Have you been diagnosed with COVID-19 by a licensed healthcare provider (for example, a doctor, nurse, pharmacist, or other) in the past 10 days?
5. Have you been told that you are suspected to have COVID-19 by a licensed healthcare provider in the past 10 days?
